



About measures to prevent the spread of COVID-19

At guntû, we are taking constant precautions to reduce the potential for spread of COVID-19 according to our own rigorous guidelines, which received a “Biosafety Management System” certification on July 3, 2020. Our guidelines are based on COVID-19 prevention guidelines established by the Japan Passengerboat Association and the Japan Hotel Association.

Biosafety Management System

The global COVID-19 pandemic has had a major impact on the maritime industry, particularly on cruise ships. The Japanese maritime association ClassNK quickly established its Safety Management System, a standard for measures to prevent infectious diseases on ships. The Biosafety Management System is a collaborative effort between ClassNK and the Japan Oceangoing Passenger Ship Association based on the input of experts, as well as guidelines from international organizations and related industries, and is designed to ensure safety and peace of mind for ship users.

Guntû’s measures to reduce the risk of infection

- Basic measures Use of air purifiers / Regular ventilation of interior spaces / Ensuring distance between people (social distancing)
- Passengers Pre-departure PCR testing / Antigen testing immediately prior to embarkation / Frequent hand washing, gargling, hand sanitizing / Masking
- Crew Daily check of temperature and physical health / Frequent hand washing, gargling, hand sanitizing / Masking / Periodic PCR and antigen tests / Washing and disinfection / In-house seminars on measures to prevent infection / Coordination with outside organizations to prepare for emergencies



Guntû will continue to implement rigorous measures in order to reduce the risk of infection for passengers and crew members as part of our Biosafety Management System, based on thorough consideration of the risks of contact and airborne spread.
